Re: Clark Lane Non-Motorized Access

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

Staff has prepared for Council consideration a report presenting a concept to improve the safety of non-motorized travelers on Clark Lane, between Woodland Springs Court and McKee Street. In this concept, the Clark Lane pavement will be widened and the vehicular travel lanes slightly narrowed, in order to provide 6-foot wide shoulders on both sides of the road. This will provide space for pedestrians and bicyclists. The new pavement is anticipated to remain in place with a future overall complete street improvement.

### **DISCUSSION:**

Currently, Clark Lane/Route PP between Woodland Springs Court and McKee Street (see attached location map), has no pedestrian or bicycle facilities. In order to improve the safety of non-motorized travelers, staff is presenting a concept in which the Clark Lane will be widened with full-depth pavement. A 5-foot widening is planned on both sides of the road, with the existing 12-foot wide vehicle lanes to be re-striped and narrowed to 11 feet, resulting in a 6-foot wide shoulder on both sides. A diagram showing the existing and proposed cross sections is attached.

This shoulder will provide a safer path for non-motorized users. In addition, the full-depth pavement will allow the shoulders to serve as future travel lanes, with a forthcoming project to improve Clark Lane to a complete street with dedicated bicycle lanes and sidewalks. Furthermore, this is a project that can be completed relatively quickly, and all work is expected to be accomplished within existing right-of-way. This stretch of Clark Lane is currently in the jurisdiction of MoDOT; therefore, the improvements will be coordinated with MoDOT.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

The concept cost estimate is \$400,000. Possible funding sources include a transfer from the Annual Streets project.






## SUGGESTED COUNCIL ACTIONS:




# PROPOSED WIDENING
