AN ORDINANCE

accepting grants from the Youth Community Coalition (YC2) to be used by the Police Department for enforcement activities; appropriating funds; and fixing the time when this ordinance shall become effective.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City of Columbia accepts grants from the Youth Community Coalition (YC2) in the amount of \$14,000.00 to be used by the Police Department for enforcement activities.

SECTION 2. The sum of \$5,000.00 is hereby appropriated from MO Foundation for Health Grant Account No. 110-2120-480.43-00 GYOUTH and \$9,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the Youth Community Coalition Account No. 110-2120-461.10-27 GYOUTH to the following accounts:

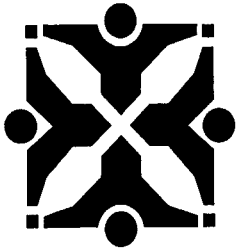

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Staff has prepared for Council consideration a council bill to accept and appropriate funds in the amount of \$14,000 from the Youth Community Coalition (YC2).

DISCUSSION:

The Youth Community Coalition Grant provides funding to the Columbia Police Department for the performance of environmental strategies which reduce the availability of alcohol, change consequences of underage alcohol use, and increase the perception of risk associated with underage alcohol use.

Funds are to be used for training, equipment, and overtime wages for officers conducting party patrols, shoulder taps, compliance checks; and stipends for youth involved in the completion of the above strategies.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Grant provides funding for enforcement activities. No matching funds.

VISION IMPACT:

Funds are to be used for the following purposes:

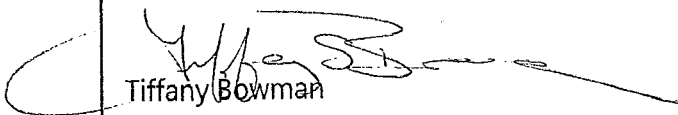
- To provide training for officers involved in compliance checks;

- To provide equipment needed to perform the above strategies more efficiently.

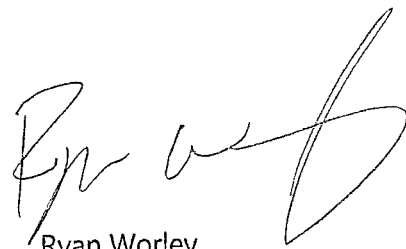

Furthermore, acceptance of this funding means that the Columbia Police Department agrees to work with YC2 to allow YC2 youth and adult volunteers to provide an instant reward (\$5 - \$10 coupon) to merchants who pass compliance during at least one multi-check event.
