AN ORDINANCE

amending Chapter 27 of the City Code as it relates to a renewable energy standard; and fixing the time when this ordinance shall become effective.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 27 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, Missouri, is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 27-106. Renewable energy standard.

The city shall generate or purchase electricity generated from eligible (a) renewable energy sources at the following levels:

- Two (2) percent of electric retail sales (kWhs) by December 31, 2007; (1)
- Five (5) percent of electric retail sales (kWhs) by December 31, 2012; (2)
- Ten (10) Fifteen (15) percent of electric retail sales (kWhs) by December 31, (3) 2017; and
- Fifteen (15) Twenty-five (25) percent of electric retail sales (kWhs) by (4) December 31, 2022-; and
- (5) Thirty (30) percent of electric retail sales (kWhs) by December 31, 2028.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.


