AN ORDINANCE

determining it is in the public interest to construct a sidewalk along the east side of Garth Avenue, between Leslie Lane and Parkade Boulevard, and a crosswalk with pedestrian activated flashing lights and center median island across the north leg of the intersection of Garth Avenue and Parkade Boulevard; approving and adopting plans and specifications; determining that the work shall be done by contract; calling for bids through the Purchasing Division; providing for payment for the improvement; authorizing the City Manager to obtain, execute and record all documents necessary for the improvement; providing for compliance with the prevailing wage law and state-mandated construction safety training; and fixing the time when this ordinance shall become effective.

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted a resolution declaring the necessity of constructing a sidewalk along the east side of Garth Avenue, between Leslie Lane and Parkade Boulevard, and a crosswalk with pedestrian activated flashing lights and center median island across the north leg of the intersection of Garth Avenue and Parkade Boulevard; and

WHEREAS, the notice of a public hearing on this project was published in a daily newspaper of general circulation in the city; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has held a public hearing on construction of the improvement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Council finds that the construction of a six-foot wide sidewalk along the east side of Garth Avenue, between Leslie Lane and Parkade Boulevard, with a bulb-out at the northeast corner of Garth Avenue and Leslie Lane and bulb-outs at the northeast and southeast corners of Garth Avenue and Phyllis Avenue, and construction of a crosswalk with pedestrian activated flashing lights and an eight-foot wide center median refuge island across the north leg of the intersection of Garth Avenue and Parkade Boulevard, all in accordance with City of Columbia Street and Storm Sewer Specifications

and Standards, in the City of Columbia, Missouri, is necessary for the welfare and improvement of the city and that it is in the public interest that such improvements be made.

SECTION 2. The plans and specifications for this improvement, as prepared by the Director of Public Works, are hereby approved and made a part of this ordinance by reference.

SECTION 3. The construction of the improvement shall be done by contract in accordance with the plans and specifications, the laws of the State of Missouri, and the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Columbia, Missouri.

SECTION 4. The Purchasing Agent is hereby authorized to call for bids and execute a contract for the improvement.

SECTION 5. Payment for this improvement shall be made from Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission Enhancement Funds, Capital Sales Tax Funds and such other funds as may be lawfully appropriated.

SECTION 6. The City Manager is authorized to obtain, execute and have recorded all licenses, easements, deeds and any other conveyances or instruments necessary for the City to complete this improvement.

SECTION 7. The contract for the improvement shall provide that not less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages, as found by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations of Missouri, shall be paid to all workers performing work under the contract. The contractor's bond shall guarantee the faithful performance of the prevailing hourly wage clause in the contract. The City shall also cause to be inserted into the contract a stipulation that all laborers and mechanics employed by the contractor or subcontractors in the performance of work under the contract shall be paid wages at rates not less than those prevailing on similar construction in the locality as determined by the Secretary of Labor in accordance with the Davis-Bacon Act.

SECTION 8. The bid specifications and contract for the improvement shall provide that the contractor and any subcontractor shall provide a ten-hour Occupational Safety and Health Administration construction safety program (or a similar program approved by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations) for all employees working on-site. All employees working on the site of the improvement are required to complete the safety program within 60 days of beginning work on the improvement project.

SECTION 9. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

Re: Easement Acquisition and Bid Call - Garth Avenue Sidewalk from Leslie Lane to Parkade Boulevard

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Staff has prepared for Council consideration legislation authorizing the acquisition of necessary easements, and a bid call through the Purchasing division for the construction of the Garth Avenue Sidewalk project. The project includes sidewalk along the east side of Garth Avenue, from Leslie Lane to Parkade Boulevard, and a crosswalk across Garth Avenue at Parkade Boulevard, as shown on the attached location map and plan sheets. Transportation Enhancement funding requires the construction contract for this project be awarded by June 2014. A public hearing was held on January 21, 2014.

DISCUSSION:

The proposed project is to construct a 6' wide sidewalk at the back of curb, with a bulb-out at the northeast corner of Garth Avenue and Leslie Lane, and bulb-outs at the northeast and southeast corners of Garth Avenue and Phyllis Avenue. The bulb-outs will help with cross slopes in the crosswalks and will provide a traffic calming effect along Garth Avenue. A crosswalk will be constructed across the north leg of the intersection of Garth Avenue and Parkade Boulevard, with pedestrian activated flashing yellow lights and an 8' wide center median refuge island.

Four (4) temporary construction easements are needed from four (4) separate property owners. Right of Way plans showing the proposed easements are attached, as well as plan and profile sheets, and a property owner contact log.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The project is estimated to cost \$293,600. The City will fund the required 20% local match of \$58,720, with MHTC funding 80%, or \$234,880.
