EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

An ordinance appropriating first quarter, year two funding of the FDA grant in the amount of \$17,500, effective July 1, 2013.

DISCUSSION:

On July 1, 2013 the department begins the second year of a five-year grant with the FDA. An appropriation is necessary to align the federal grant cycle with the City's fiscal year.

The purpose of this funding is to enable the department to advance towards achieving FDA Voluntary National Retail Food Program Standards, part of a national effort for quality improvement in food safety programs to assure food safety in the community. This quality improvement initiative also supports the agency goal of achieving National Public Health Accreditation in 2014.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Funding was not anticipated during the FY13 budget process. An appropriation of \$17,500 is necessary. Funding for the remainder through year five, will be included in subsequent budgets.
